


Ships participating in The Tall Ships Races 2011 will cruise at their leisure between Greenock and Lerwick (Shetland) from 12 to 21 July 2011.



With a harbour offering excellent protection from open waters, it has been recognised as a seafarer's haven for centuries.

Located within a short distance of the harbour, the town has many delights to offer visitors, such as craft and gift shops, award-winning cafés and restaurants, sports facilities, museum and magnificent hill walks overlooking the town.
